# We are a SunSmart school. ALL STUDENTS NEED A HAT Does your child have one?

A reminder to all families that the Education Department does not hold any insurance for student accidents or ambulance transport. Families are responsible for paying the cost of medical treatment for injured students, including the cost of ambulance attendance/transport. Families can purchase insurance policies from commercial insurers. The Education Department does not hold any insurances for personal property brought to school by students, staff or visitors, and it has no capacity to pay for loss or damage of such property.

The Victorian Government has committed to continue the initiative to ensure students can take part in school camps, sporting and excursions events. The Camps, Sports and Excursion Fund (CSEF) provides \$62.50 this year for eligible students. Payments go directly to the school and will be tied to the student. Families holding a valid means-tested concession card will be eligible. Concession card must incorporate 27<sup>th</sup> January 2020. Full details and an application form are available at the office for families to complete. You must bring your concession card for us to take a copy of as well. If your child is new to our school, you will need to apply at our school this year. The closing date for applications is Wednesday 24<sup>th</sup> February. Funds will be available in Term 2 for successful applicants.

#### **CONVEYANCE ALLOWANCE**

Conveyance Allowance is an allowance provided by the Department for children's transport to school. To be eligible to receive this allowance, a student must;

- \* Live more than 4.8 km by the shortest practicable route from the nearest school attended
- \* Be enrolled at the nearest government primary or secondary school, or at the nearest appropriate

registered non-government school. Please call to the office to collect the appropriate paperwork.

### Victorian Student pass

The Victorian Student pass provides travel for students on all metropolitan trains, trams and buses, all regional bus services and all V/Line train and coach services operating wholly within Victoria. The Victorian Student Pass is issued on a myki.

Students 16 years and under, who do not wish to purchase a Student Pass are not required to obtain a VPT Student Concession card but can still get a child myki for concession travel by visiting a metropolitan premium train station, a myki-enabled staffed V/Line station, a myki retailer, visiting ptv.vic.gov.au, or calling 1800 800 007. A \$3 card fee applies.

# Semper Dental is returning to our school on Tuesday March 9th

Your child will have the opportunity to join the Semper Dental 2020 school dental program. The twice-yearly treatment program is offered in accordance with The Australian Dental Association recommendation that all primary school age children should see the dentist every six months. At each visit Semper Dental will provide a preventative treatment program. Preventative treatment involves an oral examination and treatment such as scale, cleaning, fluoride application and fissure seals where necessary. They will then provide you with a report on each visit and will inform you if your child requires additional dental care.
