# Reading Work Pack – Weeks 1 and 2

<p style="text-align: center;"><b><u>TASK 1</u></b></p> <p style="text-align: center;"><b><u>Making Connections</u></b></p> <p>When we read, a skill good reader's do is make personal connections with the text. This can help us if we've shared similar experiences to a character or if we've read something similar before. There is a text below that you can make connections with to yourself. If you want to make text-to-text connections that is also accepted. Feel free to make to connections with the texts you read yourself.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><b><u>Task 2</u></b></p> <p style="text-align: center;"><b><u>Exploring Verbs For 'Said'</u></b></p> <p>For this task, you have to write down all the different verbs for said. Once you have at least 5-10 different verbs for said, you are either to write out the meaning of each verb in your own words (you can look it up) or if you're an artist, draw it. 😊</p> 	<p style="text-align: center;"><b><u>Task 3</u></b></p> <p style="text-align: center;"><b><u>Let's Research!</u></b></p> <p>For this task, you need to choose something from a text you're reading about and research it. It could be any part of the text, a place, a person or an event that happened.</p> <p>For example, I was reading a book recently and part of it was taking place in Mozambique! I didn't know much about Mozambique so I looked it up and found out these facts:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Located in southeast Africa</li> <li>• Has wild animal reserves with lions, giraffes, elephants etc</li> </ul>	<p style="text-align: center;"><b><u>Task 4</u></b></p> <p style="text-align: center;"><b><u>Locating Figurative Language</u></b></p> <p>This is a tricky task because some texts you read won't have any. For this task, you need to identify figurative language in <b>Beach Daze</b>. (it will improve your writing!) they include:</p> <p>Similes: comparing something to something else using like or as, e.g. her face was as red as a tomato</p> <p>Personification: giving human qualities to objects which don't have them, e.g. the tree was <b>cold</b> in the strong winds</p> <p>Hyperbole: an exaggeration e.g. I was so hungry I could eat a horse!</p>
<p style="text-align: center;"><b><u>Task 5</u></b></p> <p style="text-align: center;"><b><u>Summarising</u></b></p> <p>for this task, after a day's reading, summarise the main points of what you've read. Things to think about: characters, plot, setting, complication etc</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><b><u>Task 6</u></b></p> <p style="text-align: center;"><b><u>Character Analyst</u></b></p> <p>Choose 1 character from your book and choose three adjectives to describe them. Explain why you chose the adjectives to describe them.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><b><u>Task 7</u></b></p> <p style="text-align: center;"><b><u>Change The Story!</u></b></p> <p>You can complete this task once you've finished a story. For this task, you are to rewrite an ending to a story, change it to the way you like it, or the way you wanted it to end. Discuss with someone in your family why you decided to change it.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><b><u>Task 8</u></b></p> <p style="text-align: center;"><b><u>Book Review!</u></b></p> <p>Using the template provided, complete a book review on a text you've read completely this year. Choose something that you have read recently, so it is fresh in your memory. It doesn't have to be positive, it could be a text you didn't enjoy. Remember to explain why.</p>

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

You will need to think about the <b>ingredients</b> that go into being a good friend and the <b>steps</b> you need to take to be a good friend. Use the recipe template in the pack.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><b>Revising a narrative</b></p> <p>Look at a story you have already written, and <b>REVISE</b> the text with the intention of improving the whole story. Remember to – <b>A</b>dd detail and important information. <b>R</b>emove unnecessary information. <b>M</b>ove sentences, paragraphs and ideas around. <b>S</b>ubstitute words for more interesting words.</p>

Remember to include facts, so you might need to do a little research on the topic. Remember to back your arguments with facts, not opinions. Also remember to use emotive words that will stir emotion in the reader.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><b>MONEY or FRIENDS</b></p> <p>Would you like to have lots of MONEY or lots of FRIENDS? Why? You need to explain your choice with clear reasons.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><b>Information report</b></p> <p>Write an information report on an animal that lives in one of these habitats - <b>Oceans, forests, deserts, tundra, rivers, lakes, or wetlands</b>. You will need to research and summarise important information. There is a template attached to help you with the structure, remember to use that to guide you. Try and choose an animal you very little about or an animal that really interests you.</p>





### Ice Cream Combinations




### Sharing of Food





A lovely book called “Heroes of Black Summer” reminds us of people who helped others (including animals) during the 2019-20 bushfires. The book costs \$20 in bookshops. If one bookshop sells 7 copies, how much do they collect from those sales?
